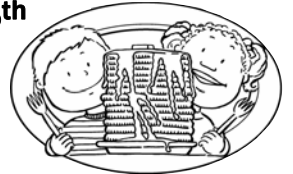

## Bible Dedication is September 14<sup>th</sup>!



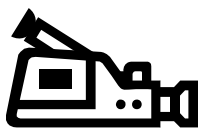

*Building a foundation. First Federated Church is building a foundation of faith through Christian Education. 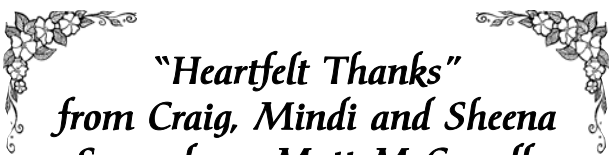

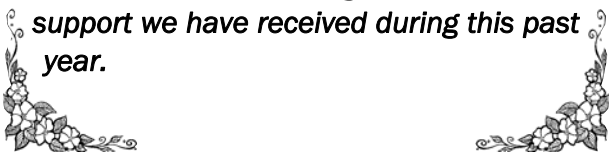

## GLIMPSE OF GRACE. . . by Frosty

Over the last few weeks I have been thinking a lot about the old movie "Bruce Almighty." In it there are several Job-like scenes where Bruce, the Jim Carey character, stands face to face with God, played by Morgan Freeman. In one of the exchanges God says to "Bruce," "Your problem, Bruce, is that you spend too much time looking up. All the things you've been doing with the power I gave you - they're not miracles - just magic tricks. A single mother, working two jobs and keeping her kids in school and off drugs - now that's a miracle! Stop looking up all the time," continues God, "and stop looking to me all the time. Look at yourself - you be the miracle!"

One of the prayers that we frequently use during communion summarizes the story of the Christian faith. "You have told us your purpose in commandments to Moses, and called for justice in the cry of the prophets." The problem is that we humans just didn't "get it." So God decided to try a different route. "At the right time," Paul wrote in one of his letters, God decided to become "one with us"—*Immanuel*.

Jesus called disciples to walk with him. By spending time with Him they learned what the prophets really meant when they challenged people to love, kindness and mercy and to walk humbly before God. He showed them that love is not an emotion or a feeling but an action. He didn't really say anything new—"Do not think that I have come to abolish the law and the prophets"—but he showed them what life in the Kingdom of God looks like.

At a recent leadership conference attended by our pastors and two program staff members a speaker challenged each of us to live up to our calling as a disciple. Like the movie "Bruce Almighty" he said when Jesus called the disciples to be the Body that he didn't have a plan "B" in mind.

In one of their songs the musical group *Casting Crowns* asks a tantalizing question. "If we are the body, Why aren't His arms reaching? Why aren't His hands healing? Why aren't His words teaching? And if we are the body Why aren't His feet going? Why is His love not showing them there is a way? There is a way."

When my youngest daughter was in Africa, a street child of about 6 asked her if she was a Christian. She

told him that she was and asked if he was. He used to be he said, but he gave it up. Puzzled she asked why he gave it up. His reply startled her. "If God is love, as the Christians tell us, then how come I hurt so much."

In an interview rock singer Bono called the suffering that this child experiences "stupid suffering." In other words, it is suffering caused by humanity's cruelty and totally avoidable. One need look no farther than the suffering caused by the recent Myanmar hurricanes to see an example of stupid suffering as a threatened government kept aid workers at bay while its citizens died.

Jesus invited people to walk with him. In this simple act the early disciples learned what it meant to be a community. They in turn taught others and people learned what it meant to be a disciple of Jesus by living with people who practiced what they preached. During the coming program year the staff of FFC is going to focus on what we are calling "The Big Idea." This Big Idea will examine what it means to be a disciple. We will not pretend to have all of the answers. Nor will we encourage you to check your minds at the door. What we will do, though, is challenge you to "be the miracle" embodying God's love.
