What's in a hug?

Every year, except one, since I have been the Senior Minister of FFC I have volunteered to be a Reading or Study Buddy at a District 150 school. The past few years it has been at our neighborhood school, Thomas Jefferson. I work with second graders. I am not a trained educator. The teacher I work

with knows this. What I am, though, is someone who genuinely cares for children. The teacher does not have me work with the child who needs the most academic help. She assigns me two students; students who just need caring attention.

This year one of my students has several siblings by different fathers. She is a kind child who just needs encouragement and someone to pay attention to her-really pay attention to her. We will review her spelling words and she will read something to me--usually a book that is a grade or two below her grade level. Recently, she has asked me to read a book to her as our time draws to an end. I suspect that no one has read to her on a consistent basis.

The other student is a bright little boy who reads waaay above his grade level. He laughs and is quick witted. Recently, as I walked him back to his classroom, he stopped outside the door and gave me a hug before going in to class. I was surprised. It was unexpected and out of character.

So, what's in a hug. Validation. Warmth. Care. Both of "my" students this year have given me far more than I ever gave to them. I don't believe for a minute that any of the students that I worked with will remember me after a new school year begins, let alone in a lifetime. But it's not about me. I don't volunteer because of what I get out of it. I volunteer because I am a follower of Jesus. I volunteer because each child, each person is important to Jesus. Every individual--you and me and the stranger who is totally foreign to us--is a child of God, precious in the sight of God.







Glimpses of Grace . . . Pentecost in a Tornado

Many years ago, when I was a boy on the cusp of my teenage years, I was in an F-3 tornado. It was on a warm, humid late summer-early fall afternoon shortly after school let out for the day. With a few other students I hung around after school because my mother was attending a meeting. About a half an hour later the sky began to darken as thunderheads rolled in from the northwest and the temperature dropped. A welcomed breeze carried the salty refreshing smell of a summer rain. Large drops soon fell lazily from the sky, then, just as suddenly, they turned into pellets of hail as the winds picked up. Suddenly, without warning, what was a summer thunderstorm turned into a violent swirling wind. I did not hear the deafening train-like roar that is often used to describe tornados. I didn't hear anything at all but instinct took over as I ran down a hallway dragging a smaller boy by the hand. I later learned that the silence I experienced was due to the tornado's vacuum effect as it touched down near me.

Within a matter of seconds, the tornado passed but not before destroying my elementary school and a few nearby homes. It's destruction was precise and lifechanging. The school was rebuilt, bigger and better than before. So were the homes. But for close to two decades afterward my heart would skip a beat or two whenever a late summer thunderstorm would roll in.

I think of that afternoon whenever I read the story of the Holy Spirit's descent upon the disciples at Pentecost. "And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind" the writer said. Touched by the power of the Holy Spirit, the disciples were forever changed. Previously fearful, they were emboldened. They left the safety of the place where they huddled and charged into the world proclaiming the life changing message of God's forgiving love in Jesus Christ.

The life changing power of the Holy Spirit continues to descend upon us "like a violent wind" bringing new life and new possibilities as old structures and ways of doing things are changed, transformed, and remodeled into the likeness of the Kingdom of God. Individuals are also changed; "reborn" from the likeness of the "old Adam" into the image of Christ living into our "adoption" of children of God and heirs of the Kingdom. This transformation is a glimpse of grace.
