The LOGOS Ministry and FFC



Friends,

On February 25, 2017 I went to a Logos conference in Oak Park, Illinois. I did so for a few reasons. First, because I have witnessed the positive impact Logos has had here at FFC and I wanted to know more about the program itself. I also went because the four pillars of Logos: family time, worship skills, recreation, and Bible time reflect the vision statement of FFC "Making disciples through worship, as we praise and glorify God; fellowship, as we care for one another; mission as we embody God's love; giving,

as we express gratitude to God" which makes the Logos ministry a seamless and integral part of FFC living into its vision. Finally, I went because the Logos' understanding of ministry has shaped the way a mentor of mine leads the church they serve.

At the all day conference I learned many things about Logos. Instead of detailing them all, as they are numerous, I'd like to share a couple

highlights. The first is that Logos is an intergenerational ministry model. One that relies on all of the people of church to grow Christian relationships and develop Christian disciples. As the leaders of the training pointed out: Logos is not just for children. Logos is not just for youth. Logos is not just for young adults. Logos is not just for adults. It is a program designed from the very beginning to include all generations. As Logos states "If one generation is missing then the entire programs suffers, is less effective, and missing a vital part of the body of Christ." Logos' effectiveness is dependent upon the entire church body being active participants. Churches are one of the few places where people from several different generations gather for a single purpose. Logos has recognized this reality and works to engage everyone in ways that edify and deepen their relationship with one another and with God.

Another highlight: Logos is much more than a simple Wednesday evening program. It is ministry that seeks to develop disciples through Bible study, fun, and a shared meal, energizing the whole church through the building of relationships both within the church and outside of the church. Although the program usually happens on Wednesday evenings, it does not cease to function during the other six days of the week. The time needed for Wednesday evening preparations are, in and of themselves, a ministry. Those hours spent getting things ready are times when fellowship and relationship development take place. During the conference I heard story after story of how those who prepared the meal, readied the family time, and studied for the Bible lesson drew closer to one another and ultimately to God through their planning time. Logos isn't just a once a week program it is a way of ministry that reaching into every day and the whole church.

The Logos training I received helped me to see why my mentor has based much of their ministry off of Logos, and rightly so. Logos is a relatively simple concept grounded in the teachings of the Bible. Specifically, from Acts 2:42 "They devoted themselves

This is a verse I am familiar with, but until that day of training I saw it as more of a statement than a means to discipleship. Having gone through the training my understanding of the Logos ministry has deepened and so too has my relationship with God. Being in relationship with God means being in relationship with other people. We, as Christ's disciples, do this with the entire church,

all generations, and also with those outside of the church. The ministry of Logos is done through intentional family time, worship skills, recreation, and Bible time. Logos is a great model of ministry that has helped me to better see my calling and the mission of First Federated Church.

Have you ever thought something worked one way, only to find it didn't?

Like maybe as a kid you thought the bathtub drain was a death trap. Then you learned it couldn't actually suck you into the sewer and that was a game changer.

Or maybe you were sure that the closet should be avoided because monsters lived there. Then you learned they didn't. That changed your morning routine for sure.

Any time you learn new information, it can turn your world upside down.

Jesus had a habit of doing just that with the people closest to Him. He often did or said things that were the exact opposite of what anyone expected. He'd take ideas that everyone agreed with, ideas that everyone would say, "Of course, that's just the way it is," and He'd flip them upside down. He would tell people to do the exact opposite of what they thought.

This was especially true when Jesus talked about how we treat people, specifically people who like us, people who don't, and people we don't even notice.
