
Annual Congregational Meeting

Why First Federated is where I choose to worship

My first visit to First Federated was during the Christmas season. We have a beautiful sanctuary especially when it is decorated for Christmas. Frosty gave one of his fabulous sermons and threw in some of his quirky humor. The choir was great and we sang lots of Christmas songs. I enjoyed it very much. What made me stay, though, was Missions.

I was born into a UCC church in Wisconsin, and my mom signed me up for volunteer work all the time. I rebelled a bit at first, but after a while I found that is just what our congregation did. Now I find that if I am not active beyond coming to church services, I am not really fulfilling my responsibilities to my faith.

The next Spring, I heard that the congregation was organizing to help build a Habitat House on Seneca Place. I thought that sounded like fun, and my wife would be the first to tell you that I have too much free time anyway. From there, I was hooked. I got to know Frosty and Darren Hoffman and the Kowalskes and the Calders, and then I worked with Donna Hoerr on a missions funding idea for Mombasa setting up a booth selling art at a farmers market. It didn't make much money, but we had fun. From there, Donna talked me into joining the Missions committee where I got to meet Sally and Marylee and Linda and all my other Mission friends.

One of my favorite memories was going on a Mission trip with Daren and his dad, Jim. Jim' group from Missouri and ours from FFC joined forces to build a Habitat house in Bay St. Louis, Mississippi. We had a great time and I got to know many people in the congregation that I now call friends. We eventually joined Jim and his team for three Habitat builds down south, and are looking for more opportunities in the future.

It has been my privilege to serve as Missions chair for six of the past seven years. Working side by side with families building their homes for Habitat has been very rewarding. Traveling to Mombasa to visit the Boys home we support may be the most unnerving thing I've ever done, but it very much confirmed my support for the mission. I also got to know my pastor very well!

We as a congregation have another opportunity to build a Habitat House. We will be building for a young woman named Kenya Beck. Kenya is a single mother of one with a good job, and has already put many service hours in at the Habitat ReStore on Main. We will hopefully be starting the build in November. Kenya is very excited to help. This is a great opportunity for you to get involved and give back to your community. We also have volunteer opportunities in our Snack Pack program benefiting children at Whittier School. Please help me in demonstrating our commitment to Missions in our community and the world.

The Word

Last month I wrote about the first component of the Lord's Day Service, The Gathering, in the church newsletter. If you recall The Gathering has six parts to it: Call to Worship, Opening Prayer, Hymn, Confession and Pardon, The Peace, and another Hymn. The second component of the Lord's Day Service is The Word and it too has quite a few pieces. The first is the Prayer for Illumination. This prayer is offered before the reading of the Bible. The intention behind the prayer is to seek the illumination of the Holy Spirit and to call upon God to make us receptive to the life-giving Word (Jesus Christ) through the Holy Scriptures.

Following the Prayer for Illumination is the reading of the Bible. The First Reading is usually an Old Testament text. One of the first 39 books of the Bible. Up next is a Psalm. It can be read or sung and with the talented Mr. Russel Boulton leading us in worship we often hear it sung. After the Psalm is the Second Reading, which is often an Epistle (a letter written by Paul or another New Testament writer). Lastly, a Gospel (Matthew,

Mark, Luke, John) text is read. So how are the readings selected for each service? First Federated Church follows what is called the Lectionary. The Lectionary is a guide for reading through the Bible in a three year period. Each year is given a letter: A, B, C. We are currently in year C and soon we will be in A. Thus, the texts read each Sunday are not randomly picked, but thoughtfully selected and in doing so the entire Bible is heard.

The Sermon is to share with us the presences of Jesus Christ through the Holy Spirit who offers to us all grace and calls us all into obedience.

Next is The Sermon. The Sermon is designed to communicate to us that the God who speaks in the Bible speaks to us now. The God who has acted in biblical history acts now. Also, another intention of The Sermon is to share with us the presences of Jesus Christ through the Holy Spirit who offers to us all grace and calls us all into obedience. So The Sermon helps us see God's presence and activity in us and the world.

After The Sermon comes The Invitation. The Invitation is an opportunity for anyone who wishes to make or renew his or her personal commitment to Christ and his kingdom. This doesn't happen much so it rarely makes it into the order of worship on a regular basis, but it is still an important part of the worship service.

Then a Hymn is sung. This Hymn usually relates to The Scripture readings of the day or leads to the Prayers of the People, Baptism, or a Pastoral Rite that might follow.

After the Hymn one of two things may happen. There can be either an Affirmation of Faith or a Baptism. The Affirmation may be done individually or corporately. If it is done corporately it is often done via the Nicene Creed or Apostle's Creed. Whether individually or corporately the point of Affirmation is to give an assent to the faith in the words of the Creed. The other is Baptism. Baptism is an act of the whole church. It is to be celebrated within the context of corporate worship. Baptism itself is a sign and seal of God's self-giving, by which God's grace is made available to us. It is also the primary sign of the covenant of grace God so mercifully gives.

Coming after Affirmation or Baptism is the Pastoral Rite of The Church. In this piece of liturgy those who have previously been baptized may make public their profession of faith for the first time, reaffirm the covenant into which were baptized, or transfer their membership. It is also a time for those who are installed as church officers, those commissioned for service in and to the church may be included here. Another way to think about it is to think of it as a time for a church member to share their personal testimony and their commitment to follow Christ.

The last part of The Word, the second component in a Lord's Day Service, is the Prayers of the People. This prayer is prayed in response to the Word. In it we acknowledge God's presences in the world and activity in our lives. In the Prayers of the People we address God in a special way as priestly intercessors for each other and for the world at large. We pray for our congregation, for the people we know, for those we don't know, for those in authority, for those suffering oppression,

for those who are poor, hungry, or sick, and so on. It is this prayer that the body of Christ cries out to God on behalf of all God's creation.

I hope defining these parts of the Lord's Day Service helps to bring understanding or clarity to liturgy and why it is helpful in organizing a worship service. There remain only two more components to the Lord's Day Service and those will be covered in the months to come. Until next time...





To the Members and Executive Board First Federated Church of Peoria Peoria Illinois

In planning and performing our audit of the financial statements of First Federated Church of Peoria (the Church) as of and for the year ended December 31, 2014, in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, we considered the Church's internal control over financial reporting (internal control) as a basis for designing our auditing procedures for the purpose of expressing our opinion on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Church's internal control. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the Church's internal control.

Our consideration of internal control was for the limited purpose described in the preceding paragraph and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be material weaknesses or significant deficiencies and, therefore, material weaknesses or significant deficiencies may exist that were not identified. However, as discussed below, we identified certain deficiencies in internal control that we consider to be material weaknesses.

A deficiency in internal control exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct misstatements on a timely basis. A material weakness is a deficiency, or combination of deficiencies in internal control, such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the entity's financial statements will not be prevented, or detected and corrected, on a timely basis. We consider the following deficiencies in the Church's internal control to be material weaknesses:

Segregation of Duties

Due to the Church's small size, many of its accounting functions are performed by individuals with little oversight provided. Ideally, duties involving the custody of assets, authorization of transactions, and record-keeping should be segregated among numerous people. For many smaller organizations, budget constraints make it difficult to provide for adequate segregation. However, from a fraud deterrent perspective, adequate segregation is very important as it helps protect both the organization and the personnel involved.

Receint

Positive aspects of the controls over receipts include – the ushers preparing a written report at initial collection and a board member (or other volunteer) assisting the accountant with counting the donations and making the deposit. However, there are a handful of members that have requested direct deposit of their donation commitments to the Church. The accountant handles this process with little oversight. We recommend an independent person review these direct deposits on a regular basis to determine all have been properly approved and all are being properly deposited in the Church's account.

Disbursements

Positive aspects of the controls over disbursements include – committee members or the pastor are involved with approving the transactions and a second person is involved with signing checks. However, the accountant (who is an authorized check signer) records all transactions in the general ledger and prepares the month-end bank account reconciliations; no one reviews the reconciliations. We recommend an independent person receive the unopened monthly bank statements and review all activity (especially cancelled checks) before the accountant receives the statement for reconciling. We are pleased to note that – beginning in 2015 – an independent review is being performed by the treasurer.

Preschool Accounting Process

Virtually all of the Preschool accounting functions are performed by the director, with very little oversight by other personnel. Also, the system used (*Microsoft Word* billing and *Microsoft Excel* receipt records) is easily prone to mistakes. There is no easy method for matching receipts to billings. We recommend an independent person regularly review the billing and receipt information. We also recommend a more sophisticated system be used.

OTHER REQUIRED COMMUNICATIONS

We have audited the financial statements of the Church for the year ended December 31, 2014, and have issued our report thereon dated September 21, 2015. Professional standards require that we provide you with information about our responsibilities under generally accepted auditing standards, as well as certain information related to the planned scope and timing of our audit. We have communicated such information in our engagement letter dated April 20, 2015. Professional standards also require that we communicate to you the following information related to our audit.

Significant Audit Findings

Qualitative Aspects of Accounting Practices

Management is responsible for the selection and use of appropriate accounting policies. The significant accounting policies used by the Church are described in Note 1 to the financial statements. No new accounting policies were adopted and the application of existing policies was not changed during the year. We noted no transactions entered into by the Church during the year for which there is a lack of authoritative guidance or consensus. All significant transactions have been recognized in the financial statements in the proper period.

Accounting estimates are an integral part of the financial statements prepared by management and are based on management's knowledge and experience about past and current events and assumptions about future events. Certain accounting estimates are particularly sensitive because of their significance to the financial statements and because of the possibility that future events affecting them may differ significantly from those expected. The most sensitive estimates affecting the financial statements involved the valuing of pledges receivable and the related allowance for doubtful accounts.

Corrected and Uncorrected Misstatements

Professional standards require us to accumulate all misstatements identified during the audit, other than those that are clearly trivial, and communicate them to the appropriate level of management. Management has corrected all such misstatements. The following material misstatements detected as a result of audit procedures were corrected by management:

Effect on Change in Net Assets

To record current year fixed asset additions \$ 859,672
To establish contribution receivable 100,000
To adjust prepaid and payable amounts (33,048)
To record depreciation expense (151,140)
To adjust pledges receivable (495,759)

Difficulties Encountered in Performing the Audit

We encountered no significant difficulties in dealing with management in performing and completing

Disagreements with Management

For purposes of this letter, professional standards define a disagreement with management as a financial, accounting, reporting, or auditing matter, whether or not resolved to our satisfaction, that could be significant to the financial statements or the auditor's report. We are pleased to report that no such disagreements arose during the course of the audit.

Management Representations

We have requested certain representations from management that are included in the management representation letter dated September 21, 2015.

Management Consultations with Other Independent Accountants

In some cases, management may decide to consult with other accountants about auditing and accounting matters, similar to obtaining a "second opinion" on certain issues. If a consultation involves application of an accounting principle to the Church's financial statements or a determination of the type of auditor's opinion that may be expressed on those statements, professional standards require the consulting accountant to check with us to determine that the consultant has all the relevant facts. To our knowledge, there were no such consultations with other accountants.

Other Audit Findings or Issues

We generally discuss a variety of matters, including the application of accounting principles and auditing standards, with management each year prior to retention as the Church's auditor. However, these discussions occurred in the normal course of our professional relationship and our responses were not a condition to our retention.


