



The Gathering

In a recent conversation with a church member, I was reminded that there are bits and pieces of the Lord's Day service that often go unexplained. Maybe you have thought the same. When you open the bulletin Sunday morning you read all sorts of subtitles that seem to act as place markers in the service. These subtitles, however, are much deeper and richer than mere signposts, indicating how far along we are in our time together. There is intention behind each. Together these pieces provide the form of the service and help lead us in worshiping and praising God. In the coming months I'd like to share with you the meaning behind the different pieces included in the Lord's Day Service.

What exactly is the Lord's Day? Since the beginning of Christianity Christians have gathered together on the first day of the week to hear the word of the Lord, the Bible, read and to proclaim and celebrate the Lord's Supper. So the Lord's Day is a designated time when Christians gather together to worship the Triune God. Why does it happened on Sunday and not, say, Wednesday? Because the early Christians recognized the importance of the resurrection and the day on which it happened. The Holy Scriptures tell us that happened on Sunday. So on Sundays we remember In the name of Christ and celebrate the resurrection. Therefore, our we answer God's call, Sunday service is called the "Lord's Day" service (Rev. 1:10).

with other Christians When you are in church and you have a bulletin in as the community of faith. hand there are a few basic movements of the service for the Lord's Day. They are Gathering, The Word, The Eucharist, and the Sending. It is the Gathering I will focus on here. To begin part of the purpose of the Gathering is to communicate that worship begins with God. God has taken the initiative and called us into being. In the name of Christ we answer God's call, gather together with other Christians as the community of faith. As we gather together, we informally greet one another as members of the body of Christ. During the Gathering we may also pray silently or engage in guiet meditation. Sometimes during the Gathering music is played to help people focus their attention on God. The Gathering is also a time when church announcements are briefly given.

Within the Gathering is the "Call to Worship." The Call to Worship proclaims who God is and what God has done. Sometimes it is spoken by a single person. Sometimes it is sung; other times it is a responsive reading. Whatever way it is done the purpose is to remind us that our worship centers on God alone.

Following the Call to Worship is the "Prayer of The Day of Opening Prayer." This particular prayer is one of adoration. That is to say, we share with God our deep love and respect for God's presence in our lives. The prayer typically expresses some

theme of the day, the festival, or the season, which helps to shape the focus of the Lord's Day service. For instances, on Trinity Sunday this prayer would praise God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit.

Next up is the first Hymn of the day. This hymn is also one of praise, telling of God's goodness, majesty, greatness, and love.

After that comes the "Confession" and "Pardon". The word of God instructs all who proclaim Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior, to share with God the reality of sin in person and communal life. Therefore, the Call to Confession leads us to a time when we share with God all of our shortcomings. misdeeds, and anything that we have done counter to the will of God. Sometimes there is a moment of silence, before or after the prayer, wherein we pray to God all that we cannot say aloud. As the word of God also tells us we are not left in our sin and misery. We have been pardoned and declared righteous before God through Jesus Christ. The Assurance of Pardon tells us of God's forgiving grace. By accepting God's forgiveness we are raised to a new life.

Then "The Peace" is sometimes exchanged by those gathered to worship God. It is a moment in the worship service where we

> share the sign of God's reconciliation and peace with one another. An exchange of the Peace you might be familiar with is "The peace of Christ be with you." In response we say "And also with you." In sharing the Peace, we express the unity and love that comes only from God. When The Peace is passed we open ourselves us up to the power of God's love and healing.

The last part of the Gathering is another Hymn. This hymn is one of gladness, a song of praise for the gift of God's grace that brings us joy.

I hope this helps give a little insight into the beginning bits and pieces of the Lord's Day, what they mean and how they orient us to worship God.




