Glimpse of Grace

How do you want to be remembered? What legacy do you want to leave behind? Every day, whether we are aware of it or not, we write our legacy.

Several years ago I received a telephone call from a local hospital. Someone found the name badge of a deacon in the parking lot. The deacon's name and church were on the magnetic name badge. He had been dead for a little over a year. How long it had been in the parking lot or how it got there, I have no idea.

Picking up the name badge brought back a flood of memories. I first met him when I brought them home communion. At the time he was a retired "stay at home husband" taking care of his wife. He loved to tell stories, laugh and have coffee with his buddies. After his wife died he became quite active at church. He was in worship every Sunday, was elected a deacon and faithfully made calls on shut-ins and the hospitalized. At church potlucks he always brought KFC fried chicken, mashed potatoes and gravy. But he was especially fond of the after school Logos program.

He was a regular "table parent". Each week he arrived early and placed a wrapped piece of chocolate at each spot. One child couldn't eat chocolate, so he brought a piece of red licorice.

As I think back upon his witness I considered how each one of us leaves a part of ourselves behind when our life journey is complete.

We leave a legacy in the hearts, minds and lives of those we touched. I know that he probably did greater things in life, but the eternally enduring are those little things--those mustard seeds--that truly make a difference.



Wana Wa Mola

Our mission in Mombasa is taking the next steps in growth. We are working with the American organization Hope for Kenya as they have more frequent on site contact with Wana Wa Mola.

Recently Wana Wa Mola entered into a working relationship with Bombolulu, a Ten Thousand Villages fair trader. (A Ten Thousand Villages store in located in Peoria Heights.) Bombolulu provides employment and numerous other benefits, including housing, medical aid and adult education, for adults who are blind or physically disabled and who would otherwise have virtually no chance of employment in the mainstream labor market. Artisans create jewelry and other products for both local and export markets. An on-staff designer creates new jewelry lines, including both the trademark whimsical Bombolulu recycled materials jewelry and other design pieces.

Bombolulu was established in 1969. It is one of a number of branches of the Association for the Physically Disabled of Kenya Coast Branch, a Kenyan charitable organization. Bombolulu's campus includes housing units for artisans, artisan workshops, and a guesthouse to help generate income. Ten Thousand Villages has purchased products from Bombolulu Workshop since 1986. The children of Wana Wa Mola go to Bombolulu two Saturday's a month to develop skills in textiles, jewelry and woodworking from their professional staff.


