


### Veteran's Day November 11th, 2018

## 100th Anniversary of the End of World War 1

Piper Richardson is the only Canadian piper to have won the Victoria Cross, the highest of all British and Canadian military decorations. 
(The Apostles' Creed is an ancient statement of Christian faith that dates from 180 A.D.)
