One afternoon a father heard a pounding noise in the basement. He went downstairs to explore and found that his young child was using the handle end of a screwdriver to drive nails into a piece of soft pine.

"What are you doing?" the father asked.

"I'm makin' something," the child replied, "but this is a terrible hammer."

The dad reached for a box of wood screws and said, "Let me show you something." He easily twisted the screw into the wood. "Now you try."

The child did and much to the little delight, squealed, "This is easy!"

"Well," the father said as he walked back up the stairs, "You'll find that things work best when you use them as they were intended."

That's true of you and I, too. Several years ago I was in a men's bible study when one of the members talked about his frustration over being a dentist. His father insisted that he become a dentist so he went to a good private college and top rated dental school. But he found his practice to be unfulfilling. One of the members asked the dentist what he really wanted to be when he was a small boy. "A jazz pianist." "Have you ever thought about giving that a shot now?"

Later the dentist said that that somewhat offhand comment was like a near-sighted man putting on glasses. Suddenly things looked clearer. He began to see his career as a means to an end. Slowly he eased out of his dental practice and for several years now he has substituted for "vacationing" dentists while he plays jazz piano to, as he says, "the glory of God."

God made each one of us for a purpose. Our job may not be our "calling" or true vocation. If you're a "screwdriver" don't worry about being a "hammer." Both the hammer and the screwdriver can build something wonderful in God's Kingdom.

Wana Wa Mola: Swahili for "God's Children"

In December of 2018 the Mission Committee was blessed when it received an "on-the-ground" report from Carrie Watkins-Reichartz about the ministry of Wana Wa Mola. She is in Mombasa several times a year to oversee another ministry as well as serving on the Board of Directors of Wana Wa Mola.

There are currently 21 "boys" in the Wana Wa Mola home as well as an additional 250 street children being served by the ministry. The boys in the home are evaluated by a psychologist who assesses their academic and vocational abilities. All of the boys have the their most elementary educational needs met. Those who are too far behind in school are enrolled in vocational training. All of the boys become self-supporting.

There is also a spiritual component to their life together. The boys begin the day with community devotions before going to school. They end the day with community evening prayers. On Sundays they attend worship at the Crossroads Church and frequently participate in their congregational activities.

Abdallah Hussein's Story:

"I am 14 years old. I come from Kasarani. At home we did not have enough food to eat and I could not go to school because my father would not buy me the books I needed and the uniform. He beat me a lot at home. Eventually I ran away and came to Mombasa town. Living on the streets I begged for money to buy food. I used bhang (an illegal marijuana-like substance) and "mogoka" (an illegal synthetic street drug). I was often bullied by older street boys and chased by the city police.

I came to Wana Wa Mola through Crossroad church where I used to go with other street boys every Sunday to pray. I talked to one of the Wana Wa Mola mentors who agreed to let me come to Wana Wa Mola. At Wana Wa Mola life has been good because I have a place to sleep, food to eat, I bathe everyday, I wear nice clothes, there is no bulling, and I will go to school in January. I am in class five (5).
