Today, the One Great Hour of Sharing continues to be an interdenominational mission offering that cares for the least, the last, and the lost as Christians around the world do the work of God's Kingdom. This is FFC's only "denominational" offering. Unless otherwise indicated, the proceeds are divided between the United Church of Christ's support of global mission work through Church World Service and the Presbyterian Church (USA)'s Presbyterian Disaster Assistance program. For some reason Bob McCabe came my mind. Years ago I received a telephone call from a hospital information desk informing me that his deacon name badge had

Bob had been dead for nearly a year. How his name badge ended up in a hospital parking lot, or how long it had been there was a mystery. For a moment I wondered if this was a "thin places" between this reality and the next that the Scots speak of.

I also got to thinking about Bob. He loved to tell stories and laugh. He enjoyed a morning coffee with his buddies at a local diner. When he retired from a factory he spent his early retirement years as a caregiver for his wife. When she died he became quite active in the church. He

rarely missed a Sunday service. Whenever there was a pot luck his dish was KFC chicken, mashed potatoes, and gravy. He seemed to especially shine, though, as a table parent at the midweek Logos program.

He would arrive early every week and

place a small candy barusually Snickers--at every place with one exception. One child either didn't like or couldn't eat chocolate so Bob would place a piece of red licorice at that spot.

In life we leave footprints

through the things that we do. Our baptism challenges us to leave footprints worthy of following.

Communion calls us to follow in the footprints of the One who is the Bread of Life.
