What has Jesus done for you? How has Jesus made a difference in your life? Or has he? The gospel of Luke tells a story of a time when Jesus entered the country of the Gerasenes. He was greeted by someone who lived among the graves


because he was "demon possessed." Jesus restored him to his right mind and then a strange thing happened. The people who knew him as "demon possessed" were frightened. They knew how to deal with him when he was broken but not when he was whole.

The now restored man wanted to go with Jesus, to travel on with him. But then a funny thing happened. Jesus sent him away. "Return to your home, and tell others how much God

has done for you." (Luke 8: 39) So, he did. He told others. He was a changed man. He was no longer a demoniac. Jesus had made him whole.

The health and vitality of a congregation is not seen in numbers alone, though they are important. But it is seen in the willingness of individuals to be vulnerable to one another. There is a reticence to telling one another how Jesus touched our lives through the ministry and mission of First Federated Church.

In the last issue of Our Life Together I read with interest the following article:

Something to Ponder

I have often wondered why churches do not have more "endowed" ministries. Colleges and universities have endowed "chairs." Many of the most prestigious universities have religious roots. Why don't more individuals consider endowing their favorite ministry. Why not endow a "preaching chair," a "mission program," a "music or organist chair," or any number of ministries?

As a young auditor years ago I worked on several college and university audits. One of the most interesting parts of the audit was verifying the classification, purpose, earnings, and year-end balances of the various accounts in the institution's Endowment Fund. It was fascinating to see how graduates were recognizing their college or university for the impact the institution had on that individual's life and success. The amounts of the individual endowed funds that former students gave ranged from thousands to millions of dollars.

I believe leaving an endowed fund to our church is a great way to recognize the positive impact our church and our Lord and Savior have had on our lives and the lives of our family. In addition to the suggested endowed funds above, why not consider endowing your annual pledge. What a wonderful and lasting legacy that would be. As an example an endowed gift of fifty thousand dollars with an assumed annual investment return of five percent would provide

the church with an annual pledge of \$2,500. This amount would sustain that annual pledge of \$2,500 into perpetuity.

Regardless of the type of endowed fund, establishing one for our church is a great way to recognize and thank our church for the impact it has had on our lives and it leaves a lasting legacy that will live on forever.



Back to Africa ~ The Ministry of Wana Wa Mola

We are looking for a few members who are willing to visit our mission in Mombasa, Kenya later this fall. We would attend a Board meeting, visit not only Wana Wa Mola but Cornerstone Development (our supervising mission partner in East Africa). If you wish to have more information, please contact the church office.

And now, notes from Daniel Okiror, director of Wana Wa Mola. Thank you for your prayers. We now have 24 children in the home as well as two interns---Nico, from Germany and Nyamira. A third person, a volunteer, is Mary who works at a local television and takes a very active role in the lives of the boys. During a recent "street outreach" at Mwakurunge (a dumping site) 5 younger boys were added to our number. Not all of the boys are "orphans," but they live on the streets and dumping sites because their parents are too poor to care for them. Recently we had an open house for the parents of boys who live in the home. Four of the boys mothers were able to join us for the afternoon.

An organization called Operation Give Hope has provided secondary school fees for our high school boys, and WWM budgeted funds are used to enroll the elementary school boys in local schools. Public schools in Kenya are not free. There are only the costs of uniforms and books, also tuition.

As with many places, budget concerns are our greatest concern and we ask for continued prayers.

Count Your Blessings ~ Why I Give

In 2015 and 2016, Shane, Sophie and I were just getting ready to move to Peoria from St. Louis. At first I was very excited about the move as I had always loved the idea of moving "home". But over time, I became very apprehensive. I was moving away from a life we created over the last 5 years. We were leaving good jobs, a beautiful community, and friends as well as family. Since we would be building a house we would temporarily be moving in with my parents for 6-8 months, and working in the family business. Plus, we'd be making new friends in a smaller community. It was starting to seem absurd. Basically I was moving towards an unknown and taking a large risk.

About 6 months before the move I started to have extreme anxiety and moderate depression. I was in a very slow downward spiral, a spiral that I don't think I realized at the time. Just as I thought I was sitting rock bottom I developed sinus infections that I couldn't kick. I was put on large doses of antibiotics and steroids. It was then that we discovered that I'm severely allergic to some medications.

Anxiety turned to panic attacks. Depression turned severe and insomnia developed. I hit rock bottom and wanted it to end. You know you are at rock bottom when you want to check yourself into a hospital while on vacation in Cabo San Lucas, Mexico with all my in-laws present! My wonderful husband and psychologist gave me the courage to get back to the State, and on the road to recovery.

During a very long night at the hospital interrogating the universe and waving my accusatory fist in the air, frustrated as to why I was going through this, why I was not strong enough, and my biggest question, "What's the purpose of life?" After all, we're all going to die. Then, all of a sudden, a little voice from within whispered "Love" and a powerful presence wrapped me in the biggest hug I had ever felt. "It's love"--the purpose is love.

I told Shane the next day that I wanted to look for a church. He investigated probably every church within 30 miles, and we ended up here at First Federated. I still remember our first Sunday, and that Presence that I felt that night at the hospital was sitting next to me.

There is not a Sunday that goes by that I do not hear something in the sermon that I need to hear, whether it's fuel for the week, challenging my current perspectives, charging me to take action- or providing comfort.

I give so that my family and I have a tangible place to go to worship together, to hear stories that are thousands of years old that ground us in tradition. These ancient stories are brought to life in Frosty's sermons, and still ring true today. They remind us what it means to be human.

I give so that hopefully anyone who partakes in any given Sunday will hear what they need to hear for both their personal and spiritual growth, find comfort, and be challenged or charged.

I give so that you and I can fully live into our humanity and divinity.

INTERESTED IN DEDICATING A SUNDAY?

Each Sunday we have an opportunity for a Chancel floral dedication. We have two types of dedications: floral dedication or financial contribution dedication.

Your dedication can be an every year dedication or a one-time-only dedication. Continuing dedications will be contacted yearly in the month prior to confirm commitment and information.

Floral contributions are real floral arrangements. You choose the florist, choose the arrangement, pay for, and make arrangement for delivery. You will provide the church office with your dedication information.

For financial contribution dedications one of our beautiful permanent arrangements will be placed in the Chancel. Your dedication in our Sunday bulletin will state that the arrangement represents a "contribution to" and will state your choice of dedication recipient. Your recipient can be, but is not limited to any FFC department or Mission project.
