When you receive this newsletter we will begin the "holiday ride:" All Saints Day, Thanksgiving, Advent, and Christmas. It is at this time of year that I get out my well worn copy of Charles Dickens'

timeless parable of redemption, A Christmas Carol.

The novelette is set on Christmas Eve and begins with Ebenezer Scrooge, a bitter greedy old curmudgeon of a man whose world has grown small with the passing of the years. As he walks home on a foggy cold December night he hears strange noises--a coach roaring down the street, voices in the mist. These apparitions continued as he settles down to a bowl of soup in the comfort of his bedroom. Suddenly the room comes alive. A service bell, covered with cobwebs from years of disuse, rings wildly, and the face of Jacob Marley, his long deceased partner, appears on the mantle.

And then, Marley himself, or the ghost of Marley stands before him. Weighted down with heavy chains and metal money boxes he frightens Scrooge. "Speak comfort to me, Jacob," Ebenezer begs. "I have none to give," Marley replied. The chains and metal money boxes that he carries with him throughout eternity forged by his past decisions--those things that he should have done but failed to do.

At a loss for words, Scrooge tells Marley that he always considered his deceased partner was a "good man of business." At this the ghost shrieks, "Business! Mankind was my business. The common welfare was my business. The dealings of my trade were but a drop of water in the comprehensive ocean of my business."

Each year I ponder, "What business am I in?" For that matter, "What business are you in?"

By business, I don't mean how we earn a living, but why did God deign for any of us to be born? What Purpose do you think God had in mind? After all, we are not an accident, no matter what anyone else may say or think. We are children of God, and therefore precious in the sight of God. We are the sum total of all of our ancestors. And each one of us is a unique creation. No one has ever had a set of abilities, experiences, or insights.

And while we are thinking about it, have you ever wondered what business First Federated Church is in? What was God thinking when the Almighty lead two dissimilar downtown congregations to come together--two congregations under one roof and governing board. One congregation was guite liberal, active in the abolitionist movement and boasted that the leading agnostic of the day, Robert Ingersoll, paid a "pew rent" each year. The other congregation was more conservative and maybe even reactionary. It took six different "building committees" to settle on our current location. Back then it was at the far edge of Peoria. Today it is in the city's "central" area.

And here we are over 80 years later. What did God have in mind when God birthed us?

When the Westminster Divines wrote in their catechism that God created each one of us, and even First Federated Church "To glorify God and enjoy Him forever."

In the words of Jacob Marley, "Humanity" is our business. The least, the last, the lost, and the lonely are our business. "Whoever wishes to save their life" Jesus once said, "will lose it, but whoever loses their life for my sake and the Gospel's will save it."

We find purpose and meaning in life only in so far as we give ourselves away, to the glory of God. Let us not grow weary in doing what is right.
