### Glimpse of Grace



I felt sad as I walked out of the dark sanctuary. A few weeks ago I visited a historic church in Chicago. As I entered the dark gothic structure and watched people mill around in hushed voices I made my way to the balcony. The host who greeted me as I walked into the sanctuary invited me to touch one of the Tiffany stained

glass windows that lined the rectangular worship space. "You don't have the opportunity to touch real Tiffany stained glass every day," she said invitingly.

Perched in the balcony and looking down upon the worship space below--the chancel, the pulpit, the intricate baptismal font--I silently pictured a Christmas Eve candlelight service or a joyous Easter morning service. I reflected upon shadows of the marriages and baptisms and funerals that had been marked in the stone structure. I looked at the carpet near a radiator, a floral patterned design that looked well-worn. It made me a little sad.

Located near Soldier Field I was told that parking on game day was impossible. The church had been built before the wide use of automobiles. Now parking boxes lined both sides of the street. The parking lot was a little larger than a wide alley. The neighborhood had changed. The well-to-do families whose names were familiar in Chicago, the Midwest, and beyond have long passed.

As I walked to my car I remembered the story of another cathedral. Located in Oxford, England the Earl of Wickham in 1351 commissioned an awe-inspiring structure that truly glorified God. Generations later the oak beams needed to be replaced. The elders approached the Earl's descendants to inquire about their financial support. To their great surprise and delight they were told that the Earl had planned for such a time. As the cathedral was being constructed he planted a grove of oak trees to be used for this future time.

I have been an ordained pastor for nearly 40 years. I have served small rural congregations and large urban

ones. I have heard pros and cons about church endowments. Some say that large church endowments make members financially lazy. But I do not believe this. I believe that financial robustness and laziness are really a spiritually matter of stewardship. I have seen great ministries carried out because of generous endowments. I have also seen great ministries flounder because of lack of funding. I believe that large endowments can be used to support beautiful "cathedrals," placing of literal awe, thus enabling the living

members of the church to carry out the ministry of preaching and teaching. The greatest gift that "legacy" members can leave to future generations are the resources to make future generations possible.

I believe that remembering your spiritual home in your estate planning is every bit as important as remembering your alma mater or favorite charity. Have you remembered




#### Theology On Tap Is Back!


