Gifts of the Dark Wood

Ash Wednesday, February 17th, marked the beginning of Lent, the 40-day period (not counting Sundays) prior to Easter. It commemorates the time of introspection that Jesus engaged prior to the inauguration of his public ministry. Lent is a season in which you are invited to reflect upon your life and focus upon the places where the Holy One can strengthen you, lead you, guide you.

In those times of introspection, you may notice the bright and dark sides to faith — how you can feel close to God one moment and far away the next. If you do,

you are in great company. Noted persons of deep faith throughout history have experienced those same "dark" moments in their lives: Jeremiah the prophet, Jesus of Nazareth, St. John of the Cross, Meister Eckhardt, Mother Teresa. They bravely embraced those areas and utilized them to recognize how and

where God was at work in their lives. The psychoanalyst Carl Jung in his work on individuation delved deeply into what he called the "shadow aspect" of the human persona. He taught that such aspects were not to be avoided but embraced so that we could learn from them and be empowered.

Therefore, in our Lenten worship from Ash Wednesday through Easter Sunday, we are focusing on the shadow aspects of our faith journey by utilizing the book Gifts of the Dark Wood: Seven Blessings for Soulful Skeptics (and Other Wanderers). The author identifies the seven gifts bestowed in the Dark Wood as: the gifts of uncertainty, emptiness, being thunderstruck, getting lost, temptation, disappearing, and the gift of misfits. It is a guidebook for spirituality in an uncertain world. (Many of you have already begun

reading the book and have commented how it is speaking to you and addressing issues in your life.)

Though commonly understood as a place to be feared and avoided, the Dark Wood is the surest place to meet God. It is a place where you may feel uncertain, empty, lost, tempted, and alone. We have all had these feelings at one time or another. Perhaps you are there more often than you would like. (I know I am.) Yet these feelings – these gifts of the Dark Wood – can be your greatest assets on your spiritual journey. According to the

ancients, you don't need to be a saint or spiritual master to experience profound awakening. You don't even have to be "above average." All you really need to be is struggling and open to the possibilities of encountering God.

This Lent we will explore what it means to be in the Dark Wood moments of our lives.

Not how to get out of it (or them); rather, we are going to explore what it might mean for our lives to recognize the gifts of the Dark Wood. What if times of uncertainty, failure, or emptiness are opportunities for spiritual awakening? To assist you in your discovery of self, each worship service from Ash Wednesday through Easter will be based on a different chapter of the book. And there are other venues for study online and in-person.

If you feel awkward in your search for God, want to find holiness amid your holy mess, and prefer practicality to piety when it comes to finding your place in this world, this series could be a tremendous asset for you. So, join us on our Lenten journey of discovery and empowerment. Walking with you in the life of faith,

From Our Pulpit and Staff Committee

We have navigated through unprecedented times over the past year, which has caused us many changes in our personal lives and our life together here at First Federated Church. We have endured many changes from how we worship to how we connect in fellowship. Among these changes, First Federated Church as also endured numerous personnel changes. In January 2020 Lisa Hackett joined our team as a Director of Youth Ministries, a position that has been upheld by volunteers since Zach Lysdale. Fred Weghorst was hired as the new Building and Grounds keeper.

Our longtime financial secretary, Lisa Hoepker, retired in September. We onboarded Sabrina McGrath as our new part-time financial secretary. Marcia Richardson joined our church as our organist. The most visible change was when we bid Farwell to Frosty, a friend and confidante to many. And we welcomed Transitional Minister David Ezekiel. Our staff may look different, but they are working diligently to assist our congregation in navigating both the pastoral and societal transitions that are occurring.

As we make our way back to church, hopefully many of you are getting the chance to meet and interact with

Pastor David. The interim pastor comes in as a stranger (with objectivity) and as a friend (with care), with special skills and experiences to help a congregation transition into the future.

Pastor David has been filling the regular pastoral duties and provides a set of fresh eyes as we take stock of our ministries and life together. The interim times lets us stretch our spiritual and organizational muscles, try some new approaches, refresh some

traditions, explore our past and present – dream about the future as God's people in this time and place. One of the most important tasks of the interim is to help the congregation in its openness to the future; to be ready for the new leadership.

The Next Steps:

The Executive Board will start to engage in a mission study within the next couple months. This allows us to take stock of our trajectory: where we have been, where we are now, and where we

are going. Second, we will then make the necessary adjustments so that we can move into the future we believe God is envisioning for us. Third, we will formulate a job description (profile) to attract the best pool of candidates possible. Fourth we will interview the candidates and select the best one possible to be our next installed pastor. None of this will be done in a vacuum; the Executive Board will keep you apprised of what is going on and will solicit your insights, feedback, and necessary approvals. There will even be a "roadmap" indicating every step along the way. When

we start to undertake the process, we will post that "roadmap" on the church's website with an indicator of where we are at each moment.

We look forward to traveling this road together!

From Our Buildings & Grounds Committee

The recent efforts of the Building and Grounds Committee have focused on the need to replace a portion of the church roof and the renovation and reconstruction of a number of fire doors in the Preschool area. We reported on this needed work in our Annual Report to the Congregation in December.

The roof over the original 1948 church building (sanctuary, offices and garth) needs to be replaced because the slate shingles and the underlying tar paper have exceeded their useful lives. Although regular maintenance has occurred for many years, new leaks continue to appear despite the annual patching and sealing. This summer, the roof leaked over the organ loft damaging the organ so that it is currently inoperable. The organ will be repaired, but it is not advisable to make those repairs until the roof is replaced. Fortunately, the roof over the 1965 education wing addition has an additional 15 - 20 years of useful life. The committee solicited bids from multiple roofing contractors in the city and region, conducted a life cycle cost analysis of three roof types (slate, synthetic slate, and fiberglass/asphalt) and recommended to the Executive Board that a local roofing

contractor replace the roof over the original church building with slate. The Executive Board is in the midst of planning how to pay for the new roof.

The renovation and reconstruction of fire doors in the Preschool area will begin in March or April and should conclude by July 1. The State Fire Marshal requires these renovations to bring the Preschool into compliance with the current State of Illinois fire code. State Fire Marshal approval is also a condition of maintaining our preschool license with the Division of Children and Family Services. We are using this as an opportunity to also bring the Preschool area into compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act. The construction will not interfere with church services. The preschool will

continue to operate by using Fellowship Hall as a temporary classroom. You probably will see a construction dumpster and portable potty in the parking lot. Please bear with us while our contractor performs this work.



From Our Worship Committee

Our Worship Committee meets monthly to oversee our worship processes. They work diligently to ensure our both our engagement in the worship service and our safety and peace of mind in attending in-person.

The guidelines presented by the committee have been researched and follow CDC guidelines. Thank you all for your continued corporation and support. We pray the soon we can gather without restrictions.

Following the service, you will exit through the Narthex.

Each row will be released by an usher, from back to front, please wait to be released before leaving the Sanctuary.

There will be a table on the exit path with collection plates to accept recess offerings.


Music Ministry


Lenten Book Study ~ One Church, One Book
