Year of Regrounding, Renewal, & Re-direction

Dear friends, partners, and community,

As we close the month of January, it is clear that 2026 has begun differently from many previous years. Rather than launching into drastic or overly ambitious plans, this year has invited us to slow down, refocus, and return to the core of our work.

Over the past year, I have personally navigated a period of nervous system breakdown. While challenging, this season became a place of deep learning. It forced me to listen more carefully — to my body, to the people around me, and to God. In doing so, it reshaped how I lead, how we structure our work, and how we move forward sustainably.

Presence on the Ground & Strategic Refocus

Since July last year, I have been based mostly in Mombasa, with only two months spent in the Netherlands. I sensed a strong need to have my feet firmly on the ground in Mombasa, Soroti, and Kampala — strengthening teams, stabilising daily care, and rethinking how our activities abroad, particularly in the Netherlands, can continue without drawing energy away from the core mission in Africa.

This day marks the completion of 21 days of fasting and prayer. It feels deeply meaningful to write this newsletter on the final day of that fast. I trusted God for instruction, and He has been faithful in providing clarity, peace, and renewed direction.



Wana Wa Mola – Stability Through Structure

At Wana Wa Mola, we are seeing steady progress. Major renovation work has been completed, and the compound now feels strong and welcoming. There is still work to be done inside the house, particularly as we continue learning what it means to raise growing boys with both freedom and responsibility.

Boys are naturally curious — experimenting with mechanics, wires, and tools. While creativity is encouraged, maintaining order and ownership remains important. We are grateful for Nienke, a returning Dutch volunteer who has served with us three times, who is supporting the team with soft discipline and structure-based approaches alongside our existing methods.

Mombasa and the Akogo House Sustainability Model

In Mombasa, our work continues through the children's home and Akogo House, which hosts volunteers and guests. The volunteers are meant to be sent to us by our Dutch foundation and the Africa Safari activities in Europe.

Across Mombasa, Kampala, and Soroti, we are developing land-based models inspired by Akogo House. These spaces aim to support programme activities, host volunteers, and generate modest income streams that contribute to both founder and mission sustainability.

Mission

To empower communities and youth through targeted mentorship programs that integrate Christian principles with social entrepreneurship in African products and services. We aim to create a viable space of connection where everyone feels at home, utilizing music, art, crafts, food, internships, cultural exchange, and media to foster personal and community development.

Our Goals:

To create an organization that does not depend on sponsors alone by providing entrepreneurial apprenticeship and talent development projects involving our mentees.

Our Strategy & tools

Performing arts, cultural exchange, knowledge production and character development for positive change.

- A home for 22 street boys in Mombasa Kenya

- *A home with capacity of 30 children in Soroti Uganda(13 currently in the home)*
- *A volunteer's house for our missionaries, interns, volunteers, and travellers*
- *Talent development A- Traditional*

This organizational design aims to reduce long-term dependency on donations while safeguarding the mission of Beats of Hope Africa Foundation. As the organisation continues to mature, governance structures will keep evolving to ensure clarity, transparency, and shared stewardship of purpose.

Mentorship and Spiritual Rhythm,

This year, I have intentionally reduced activity to focus on what is essential. Every Monday at 10:00 a.m., our senior mentors gather at Akogo House. We worship, pray, reflect on the teachings of Jesus Christ, review the work, identify gaps, and think through solutions together.

This weekly rhythm has become a strong anchor. Several members of our team, including myself, have faced health challenges recently. We are recovering step by step — more grounded, more intentional, and more aware of the importance of shared responsibility.

Financial Structure & Administration

To reduce daily pressure caused by unpredictable cash flow, we have reintroduced a weekly financial rhythm, with all requisitions submitted and settled on Mondays after the mentors' meeting.

From January onward, Alice, our former accountant, is again supporting the organisation. She will consolidate financial records into clear monthly reports, significantly reducing my daily financial intervention and making communication with boards and partners easier and more transparent.

Further Educational Progress & Gratitude

We are also thankful to share that Jumaane, one of our Frosty Scholars, is deeply encouraged this year as his full tuition for the entire academic year has been secured. He is currently pursuing a Bachelor's degree in Hospitality and Management at Kenya Methodist University. We now hold in prayer the remaining one and a half years needed for him to complete his studies.

For the first time in a long while, all our children in Kenya have joined school on time, with school fees fully paid. This is a significant milestone, and we sincerely thank everyone who contributed — financially, prayerfully, and through encouragement — to make this possible.

Our educational focus now turns to the children in Uganda, where transitions are ongoing. If you feel inspired to support their education, you are most welcome to do so.

Beyond Formal Education – Mutethia's Journey

We are also reminded that success does not take only one shape. Mutethia, one of the boys we reported on previously, chose to step away from formal schooling to focus on developing his talent.

Recently, he secured a contract as a dance teacher at a local school nearby — a powerful affirmation of discipline, creativity, and growth.

At Beats of Hope, we believe that success is not measured only by a university degree. For some children, success means education. For others, it means being removed from a vulnerable place for a season, being nurtured and trained, and then being released strong enough to sustain themselves with dignity.

Uganda – Strategic Transitions

In Soroti, we are taking an important step toward sustainability. Instead of continuing to rent a large house, the children are being moved into a smaller home on land we own, significantly reducing costs and dependency.

Looking ahead:

- **Soroti** will focus on children up to Form Four
- **Kampala** will support Form Five, Form Six, vocational training, college, and university
- The Kampala home, currently under construction, will also focus on Karimojong children, among the most marginalised street children in Uganda

Africa Safari (The Netherlands) – Looking Toward 2026

In the Netherlands, many people are asking:

“Daniel, where are you — and what is the plan for Africa Safari in 2026?”

The honest answer is that this year calls for intentional alignment. As I complete these 21 days of fasting and prayer, I trust that clear direction will emerge — together with the Dutch board, volunteers, and participants who have already expressed a desire to co-create the next phase of Africa Safari.

Africa Safari remains a powerful space for cultural exchange, storytelling, and bridge-building. Moving forward, it will be shaped collaboratively, ensuring it supports — rather than competes with — the core mission in Africa.

Closing

This season is not about rushing forward, but about building what lasts — spiritually, structurally, and relationally. We are choosing renewal over exhaustion, clarity over noise, and faithfulness over speed.

Thank you for walking with us, praying with us, and believing in this journey.
